Participation in interscholastic/co-curricular activities at the Berlin Brothersvalley School District is a privilege and is subject to this Code of Ethics. Participation in interscholastic/co-curricular activities is a privilege granted to a student, not a right guaranteed to them. Each interscholastic/co-curricular participant is required to do his/her best at all times.

Each interscholastic/co-curricular participant is required to refrain from the use of alcohol, tobacco, and drugs (unless prescribed by a doctor). Use <u>or possession</u> of tobacco, alcohol, or drugs shall result in that student being expelled or suspended from the <u>team</u>, <u>club or activity</u>, in addition to other administrative disciplinary action. The above include admitted use or possession of use, on or off school property, during any school activity to a coach or school personnel, faculty, or administration.

Each interscholastic/co-curricular participant will recognize the authority of his/her teacher and the administration over his/her participation in interscholastic/co-curricular. S/he will understand that for reasons of improper conduct, disobedience, low grades, etc., s/he will be expelled or suspended form the squad or disciplined in other ways as seen necessary by the teacher or principal.

Grade checks will be completed a week before each contest or scheduled event. If a student has a D during grade check:

• The student may travel and participate in the event; however, if a teacher recommends that s/he stays at school, the student will not be eligible to participate in the scheduled events.

If the student has an F on the grade check:

• The student is not eligible to participate in the scheduled event. Mr. Miller will help assist you in tutoring sessions.

The Brothersvalley FFA members will:

- 1. conduct in a manner that will be a credit to the FFA, school, family and yourself.
- 2. abide by the FFA Code of Ethics as printed in the Official FFA Manual.
- 3. abide by any additional rules set for specific FFA event attending.
- 4. abide by the FFA Code of Conduct.
