How Do We Use the Makerspace?

Teachers can incorporate makerspace, and STEM, lessons into their classrooms. Sometimes classes visit the room to engage in the activities, and other times the materials are taken from the Makerspace room and used within the regular classrooms.

K-2 teachers have used the Makerspace as a Mountaineer Reward with engaging activities for students enjoy. Third graders participate in Makerspace Mondays during their science classes. The class is given a prompt to then complete using provided materials and activity parameters. Fourth graders incorporate the Makerspace integrated across all curriculum areas.

We use the Makerspace during our Summer Library Program by connecting read alouds with STEM activities.

In the Spring, K-4 students participate in an in-house Maker Faire. In the Fall, the community is invited to participate in the Elementary Maker Faire during the Berlin Brothersvalley Community Fair.

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
