

Solids, Liquids, & Gases

Do solids, liquids, and gases even "matter"? Yes, of course they do! First graders are excited to be starting their new science unit on solids and liquids. During this unit, students will be participating in various hands-on experiments and learning different properties of matter. Students will have the opportunity to explore everyday items while describing their characteristics. Ask your little scientist to point out different solids, liquids, and gases to you!



Weather Fun!

Second graders are embarking on a study of weather. They will be doing a variety of handson experiments. Creating their own rain, clouds, thunderstorms and tornadoes, are activities that the second graders are sure to love! There is so much fun learning happening in 2nd grade!

In third grade's science unit, they have been learning about inherited and acquired traits. Students have been observing how physical characteristics are passed down through genetics and are being asked to bring in family photos. They have even learned the three main patterns of fingerprinting and how fingerprints are uniquely formed in the womb. Ask your child what fingerprint pattern they have after participating in their classroom investigation!

High Voltage

In fourth grade science class, students will be experimenting with electric circuits. Students will learn about materials that make good conductors, as well as good insulators. Fourth graders will be predicting, observing, describing, and recording their experiment results. Students will not only develop an interest in electricity, but will learn skills to analyze and solve problems. They are "amp"ed up about electricity!

Students as Leaders

Second graders will be conducting their own conferences for their parents! Students are responsible for presenting and explaining a variety of class assignments and projects to their parents from materials that have been combined into a portfolio. Student-led conferences allow students to share their portfolios of quality work, practice their communications skills, report on their school progress, practice organizational skills, assess their work honestly, and become accountable for their work and behavior.
