Each day the students recite the Pledge of Allegiance and the Mountaineer Pledge. The message behind the Mountaineer Pledge is to have PRIDE. Personal Responsibility In Daily Effort. This morning practice is to serve as a reminder to students that they need to follow the rules, try their best and take responsibility for their actions. It was intended to be a positive message that each student can control their academic results through effort and hard work. In keeping with this tradition, it is with much anticipation that we now have a Citizenship grade for each class that your child attends. This mark will inform parents and guardians of the behavior, efforts and participation of the student within the classroom. By keeping behavior separate from academics, we can work with students that are identified as having issues as well as recognize ones that are exemplary. This means of communication can serve as a bridge between the school and home that has not existed in the past. It is our hope that parents and guardians encourage students to strive for good marks in academic and citizenship grades.

Citizenship Grade: Each student's citizenship grade is evaluated

based on the following rubrics: Students need to exhibit at least two of the behaviors in each category to warrant that evaluation.

E = Excellent - *Student exhibits exemplary behavior. No disciplinary action needed.

*Always follows school and classroom rules. *Listens politely and demonstrates respect to others. *Actively participates in class most of the time. *Socializes very well with others most of the time.

S = Satisfactory - *Student exhibits good behavior; few to no disciplinary actions needed. *Consistently follows school and classroom rules. *Participates in class. *Gets along well with others some of the time.

N = Needs Improvement -

*Student exhibits inappropriate behavior. *Inconsistently follows school and classroom rules. *Occasional disciplinary action needed; teacher disciplinary action needed on three or more occasions. *Student participates in class is infrequent. *Has difficulty getting along with others.

U = Unsatisfactory - *Student exhibits unacceptable behavior. *Frequent disciplinary action needed. *Taken (Level II or III type offenses). *Student does not participate in class. *Does not get along with others.
